### *FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK*

Illness and hospitalization are a difficult but ultimately unavoidable reality of the human condition. Feelings of fear and helplessness often make these times even more difficult for us to endure. One of the essential functions of a parish faith community is to accompany those who are suffering with our prayers, our acts of support and our presence during was is frequently an isolating experience. As Catholics we also have the benefit of a special sacrament, the Anointing of the Sick, through which Our Lord imparts grace for healing, strength and consolation.

Many in the Church, especially our more senior generations, have tended to view the Sacrament of the Sick as one which ought to be received only at the end of life (extreme unction). In reality, this sacrament is much more widely applicable. The Church tells us that "each time a Christian falls seriously ill, he may receive the Anointing of the Sick, and also when, after he has received it, if the illness worsens." *Seriously ill* is not limited to end-of-life situations. Any time we face a significant medical condition, and if general anesthetics will be used for a procedure, we should consider receiving this gift of encounter with the Risen Lord.

In years past, a parish priest was permitted to view a list of Catholic patients at the hospital for the purpose of making pastoral visits. Due to privacy regulations, this is no longer the case. Parishioners requesting a hospital call, or families making this request on behalf of a sick person, *must contact the parish office or speak directly to me*. I am also happy to make sick calls to the homes of parishioners. Requests of this nature are always accommodated as quickly as possible, but it is important that the Sacrament not be unduly delayed. If you're thinking of calling, call.
