This condition affects the growth of the kidneys during gestation, and has left her in need of 12 hours of dialysis each day. Sophie is gravely in need of a living kidney donor who is both compatible and willing to make this incredible gift of life. The process for living organ donation is a detailed one, but it begins with the completion of a package of forms prepared by the hospital. Of course, we should all be keeping little Sophie and her family in our prayers.

In the Incarnation, God the Son takes the body and human soul of Jesus, and through that, the whole environment of Nature, all the creaturely predicament, into his own being (*Letters to Malcolm, 96*).

The Bible clearly distinguishes between the Creator and the created. The problem is that the creature is constantly attempting to climb upward and displace the Creator, as Satan tried to do, even though the distance between God and us is too great. We need someone who will climb down to us since we can't climb up to him.

This distinction between the Creator and the created includes not only God and man, but also the uncreated God and the created nature. Lewis suggests a connection between those two pairs. In the Incarnation, God took on a created human body. In the creation at the beginning of time, God demonstrated his power as well as his love for beauty and variety and intricate complexity. We see evidence of God in both places. And in one sense, the person of Jesus, the human nature of Jesus, is part of the created world—separate and distinct, personal and powerful, but still part of the created world.

Since the fall of Adam and Eve, the created world has been the fallen world. That means that the most important evidence of God that we need is the incarnate Son who came to our “creaturely predicament.” Since we can't climb up to God, he came to us. Since our efforts were feeble and flawed, he who knew no sin came to us, came for us and died for us. Thank God that he didn't wait for us to approach him. If he had, he would still be waiting.

PEACE LIGHT

The Peace Light is a tradition that was started in Austria in approximately 1988. It is carried out by the boy scouts of Austria. Every year an Austrian child travels with a group to Bethlehem to the Church of the Nativity to enter the birthplace of Christ and gets the flame from there. The flame is then carried from Bethlehem on Austrian Airlines to Vienna. From there the flame is spread all across Europe, much like the Olympic torch is passed.

This year, through the assistance of local people, arrangements were made to have the flame flown to Ontario. We will be receiving this peace light and we will keep this candle lit until the feast of the Epiphany. Now, more than ever, let us pray for peace.

PLANNING AHEAD FOR AN EMERGENCY: PREPAREDNESS KIT

Put together a home preparedness kit *before* anyone gets sick. When you are sick, you won't want to go out and get groceries or health supplies. Here are some examples of *health and cleaning supplies* you may want to have in your home:

- Thermometer
- Hand soap
- Pain and fever medication (e.g. acetaminophen, for example Tylenol, or ibuprofen, for example, Advil)
- Supply of prescription medications
- Masks (optional)
- Alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Cough suppressants, cough lozenges (not for children under 5 yrs.)
- Laundry detergent
- Garbage bags
- Household cleaning supplies
- Tissues, toilet tissue
- Feminine hygiene products, diapers and wipes.
