FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A few parishioners have mentioned to me that they've noticed our more regular use of the Nicene Creed at Sunday Masses. We did, in fact, begin to use this form of our profession of faith at the beginning of the Advent season. My intention is to keep it in use for the weeks of Ordinary Time that precede Lent and Easter. In those seasons, as directed by the Roman Missal, we will use the Apostles' Creed. Following Pentecost we will resume our use of the Nicene Creed until the beginning of Lent next year. Not only will this help us observe the change in liturgical seasons, but it will ensure our familiarity with both of these beautiful prayers.



EUTHANASIA & ASSISTED DYING – DR. MOIRA MCQUEEN PRESENTATION

Dr. Moira McQueen of the Canadian Catholic Bioethics Institute will offer a presentation and Q&A on the need for conscience rights protection for physicians, healthcare workers and Catholic institutions in light of the legalization of assisted dying and euthanasia. RESPONSIBLE STEWARDS OF CREATION

Close to five million litres of water are taken from Wellington County daily for a water bottling plant. This extraction of large amounts of water adversely affects the ecological balance of nature over a large area while depriving those who rely on wells of their right to water. Close to seventy-five percent of plastic bottles end up in land fill sites, thus contributing to contamination of the soil for thousands of years.
