LOOK BEYOND

Like the friends walking to Emmaus, we like to use our minds to define the problem, put everything in some kind of order, and come up with the answer.



Sometimes, though, it doesn't work very well. These two travelers gave the unknown stranger a clear presentation of the 'facts' they were trying to understand. And even when he carefully explained what it meant, they still didn't get it. They didn't even recognize that the stranger was Jesus himself!

How could this be? How could intelligent and thoughtful people miss what seems so obvious?

The problem is that they were using their minds to try to grasp something beyond the mind. The path to understanding goes through the heart and its way of knowing truth, not the mind and its identification of truth with facts. Truth is encountered when the heart is open to a larger reality than the mind can grasp.

These travelers opened their hearts when they invited a stranger to stay with them because the day was nearly done. When he broke and shared bread with them, their newly opened hearts were able to see what their hard-working minds could not.

And, like them, we shall share in the breaking of bread. What will we see?
