SERVING CHRIST IN EACH OTHER

The early Church was both sensitive to the presence of Christ within and among the members, and sensible about what needed to be done. These first apprentices, these imitators of Christ, were inclusive. They chose to address the concerns expressed by the widows, members who had no power and no access to power. But these women and their children had access to a community that valued and welcomed everyone. The first seven deacons the apostles chose were people who were sensitive and sensible. They knew what to do and they knew why they were doing it. They were “deeply spiritual and prudent.”

It is no wonder the community grew enormously and attracted members from all around, even from the Jewish priesthood, a priesthood rooted in a bloodline – the family of Levi. The new priesthood of the faithful is rooted in baptism and in the commitment to live out the death and resurrection of Christ until he comes. Sometimes fallible, sometimes heroic, human beings are mediators of God’s life, members of a royal priesthood. In our concern for one another, God is disclosed. This is what Jesus taught us and promised us. The early community got it right.
