Referring to the 'second sons', Israel's worst and most unlikely people (tax collectors and prostitutes) are, Jesus says, "entering the kingdom". The original translates this as "pushing ahead". This conjures up such a wonderfully explosive and jubilant image of a motley assembly of raggedy cadets. It truly messes up the order of things; it dissolves the receiving line. It reorders the world of Israel and offers to Israel the new and wonderful vocations of sharing its good news with the whole known and unknown world.

John the Baptizer, we are given to understand, truly understood the Word of God, the God of Ezekiel. who awaits and expects conversion and repentance, and the God of Jesus, who, though still preaching to the children of Israel, expanded the receiving line to gather in whoever came – saint and sinner, man, woman, child, Jew and Gentile, slave and free, elder and prostitute.

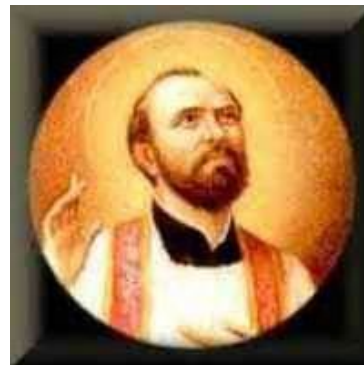
