NO TO THE NAYSAYERS

The signs of the end of life as we know it are intentionally general enough to apply to anytime. Year in and year out, somebody takes on the task of naively reading the signs of the end times for us. These, they say, are the worst of times, the times of famine and destruction, of



declining moral values. They urge us to return to the good old days, or to draw our wagons in a circle, or to take care of ourselves and our own and let the world fall apart. Well, this won't wash. It isn't based on Scripture; it isn't Christian; and it won't work. It won't help bring about God's reign. We must rest our case and our plan of action solidly on our faith that the Risen Lord is here, active and effective. We must open our hands to the work at hand; our hearts to people nearby; our concerns to those we cannot see, but whose needs we can meet. We must expect to be set against prevailing values in our society; it comes with being Christian. With the mountains and sea, we tremble in joy (not in fear); with the rivers, we clap our hands because the Lord reigns with justice. We have to see to this; it is our Christian vocation.


YEAR OF MERCY CLOSING CELEBRATIONS
