WORDS FROM THE HEART

The Beatitudes extol values that most of us try hard to avoid: poverty, sorrow, hunger, thirst and persecution. All of these things represent powerlessness, weakness, lack of control. Our whole society looks down its nose at people who are "out of control"; the bag lady rummaging through a dumpster, the grieving widow making a scene, the unemployed worker who can't put food on his or her family's table, the person who ends up in jail over a question of conscience. And yet, Jesus tells us that there is great value in the lives of those who stop trying to control their destinies and who place them in God's hand: the people who possess little of the world's things and yet possess a joyful spirit; the people who recognize the need to grieve over the state of the world and to call the rest of us to account for it; the people who suffer for their beliefs but are not marked by bitterness. The Beatitudes speak right to the heart. They don't so much challenge our material well-being as our spiritual outlook. They challenge us to have hospitable hearts, joyful spirits. At first blush, it is no great boost to the ego to think of ourselves as powerless. Certainly, it is nothing to get excited about. But, Jesus constantly reminds us to become "last", to recognize that we are "servants". Jesus seems to go out of his way to gather the weak to himself. In this gathering, we come to understand we are indeed gifted. We really are in good company.
