FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

“All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need...They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God.”

During the Easter season, we have the joy of meditating at Mass upon scriptural images of the early Christian community. In these passages, primarily from the Acts of the Apostles, we get a clear image of the communal life embraced by those who had been firsthand witnesses to the Lord's preaching and miracles. These images always invite us to consider the ties that bind our own community and how they might be deepened to better reflect our Gospel call. In a social and political climate that tends to drive us first toward individual concerns we need the help of the Holy Spirit to give primacy of place to the common good, as our faith exhorts us.

Many of our parishioners struggle to find adequate employment for the support of their families. I am routinely approached by dedicated and hardworking people who desire nothing more than an opportunity to earn a stable and just wage. I am also aware of the incredible and diverse contributions made by the people of St. Anthony Daniel Parish to virtually all facets of commerce and industry, many of whom are employers themselves. I wonder if there might be a way to connect these two realities in a way that helps us all honour more fully the Gospel for which we live.

If any parishioners are aware of a concrete and specific employment opportunity that might assist another parishioner in need, I would greatly appreciate an email or phone call so that I can facilitate an introduction. I can already think of one new Canadian with a young family (some of whom are in danger overseas) who is in urgent need of an employment opportunity.

Brothers and sisters, no aspect of our lives should be held apart from Jesus Christ and the promptings of His Gospel; we are Christians always. While it's not always easy to include Him in our professional dealings, this is a simple way of better surrendering ourselves to a loving Saviour.

This petition asks that they identify hospice palliative care as a defined medical service covered under the Canada Health Act so that appropriate funding can be transferred to the provinces for this.
