

The dictionary defines an orphan as “a child who has lost both parents through death.” This is our technical definition of the word, yet the dictionary provides another: “A person who is without protection, sponsorship, etc.” To be orphaned, then, is not necessarily to be alone. Indeed, ‘to be without protection’ can be poignantly experienced in the midst of a throng of friends or relatives. To those who have felt the pain of being orphaned by relatives or colleagues, Jesus says, “I will not leave you orphaned.” To those who have ever feared abandonment or desertion, Jesus says: “I will not leave you orphaned.”
