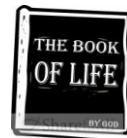
CWL NEWS

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY



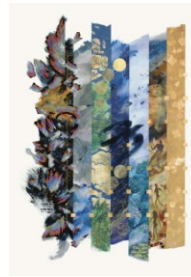
On October 21st and 22nd we will have a mission preacher in our parish, Father Ray, who will speak about his Archdiocese of Madras-Mylapore in India. The Archdiocese has a 2000 year history of Evangelical transformation. The first missionary, St. Thomas the Apostle, is the primary patron of this Archdiocese. According to tradition, St. Thomas, one of the twelve Apostles of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, walked on the sands of Mylapore and preached the Gospel to the people who embraced Christianity. This great Apostle was martyred on St. Thomas Mount, near Mylapore in the year 72 AD and his mortal remains were buried in Santhome in the Church built by him. The Diocese of Mylapore was erected in 1606, the Diocese of Madras in 1832, and the amalgamation of the two Dioceses occurred in 1952 as the Archdiocese of Madras-Mylapore. The Archdiocese has always had a special place in the pages of Indian church history and continues to effectively witness to the message of the gospel.

The Archdiocese now functions, under the able leadership of Archbishop George Antonyswamy with 126 Latin Rite Parishes, 10 Syro-Malabar Personal Parishes and one Syro-Malankara Parish. These 137 Parishes are situated in the City of Chennai and the District of Thiruvallur; covering an area of 3160 sq kms. The total population is 8,002,269 of which 440,525 are Catholics. Languages spoken in the areas specified above are Tamil, English, Telugu, Malayalam and Hindi.

The major focus of the Archdiocese is now in Tiruvallur District where there are about 54 parishes which need much attention such as evangelization, health care, education, family and women empowerment, social and youth development, since it is located in a rural area. We request your prayer and financial support in socio-economic development and proclaiming the Gospel.

St. Anthony Daniel Parish has always been very generous to the mission work of the Church in the past years. I invite you to be as generous as you can this year as well.

ST. JOHN'S BIBLE

Mark your calendars for an exciting event 500 years in the making! Throughout the week beginning Monday, October 29, the St. John's Bible will be visiting our parish. The Diocese of Hamilton is in the process of acquiring a limited edition museum-grade copy of this beautifully illuminated manuscript of the Sacred Scriptures, and we will have the privilege of hosting it for a week of discovery, prayer and marvel. During that week, the Bible will visit our three parish schools, giving young people the chance to encounter and interact with this ancient art form. There will also be opportunities, at the church, to be led through the practice of *visio divina*: a method of using the hand painted images within the Bible to inspire prayer and reflection on the Word of God. The week will culminate with the presence and use of the Bible at our Sunday Masses on the weekend of Nov. 4-5. Please keep an eye on the bulletin in the coming weeks for more detailed information about opportunities to experience the first illuminated manuscript of Scripture to be prepared in nearly half a millennium.
