WISDOM IS RADIANT AND UNFADING


“No fair!” Anyone who has spent time with young children is probably familiar with that cry of protest. Some of the parables in Scripture can, at first glance, provoke a similar reaction in us. Stories like the Prodigal Son, for example, or the workers in the vineyard who are all paid the same wage, can seem ‘unfair’ to our limited human understanding. Today’s gospel is, I think, another such story.

Why are the five ‘wise’ bridesmaids so unhelpful to their ill-prepared companions? Why is the bridegroom so inflexible, shutting the door without even acknowledging them? Is this “fair”?

Such stories are difficult for us to grasp with our limited perceptions of justice. If God’s love is comprehensive and unconditional, what are we to make of the unfortunate bridesmaids?

Yes, God’s love is unconditional and all-embracing. However, that gift of love calls forth a response from us: the response to be ready and open to receive it. All of the bridesmaids fall asleep; but when they hear the call to meet the bridegroom, only the wise ones are prepared to answer that call.

The God of surprises often beckons to us in unexpected circumstances. Let us pray that we may always keep the lamp of our heart lit so as to recognize and welcome the divine presence wherever it may be found.


