## **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

### Enjoy the Silence

I've been receiving some positive feedback about the concerted effort we've been making to observe some pronounced periods of silence at Mass. The Roman Missal prescribes these periods to assist us in better appreciating the solemnity of the Eucharistic celebration, and calls especially for a communal moment of prayerful silence following the Rite of Communion, which we've been observing for about a month now. We'll still have ample opportunity to be led in meditation/reflection by our talented and devoted music ministers during the Offertory and Preparation of the Gifts, as our choir leaders see fit. Cardinal Sarah, Prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship, wrote beautifully that silence "is an acoustic veil that protects the mystery" of God's presence at Mass, "a sort of sonic iconostasis." If you're looking for a great read and some thought-provoking questions about worship in the modern Church, I highly recommend his book *The Power of Silence*.

### Communal Anointing of the Sick

On **Saturday, March 10 at 10 AM**, we will gather in the Church to celebrate communally the Sacrament of the Sick at a special Mass offered for the intentions of all the sick in our parish. Those wishing to receive sacramental anointing during this Mass are asked to sign up in advance on the sheet in the narthex. The celebration will be followed by a time of fellowship in our Parish Life Centre.

The celebration of the Sacrament of the Sick is encouraged for all those suffering from any condition/undergoing any procedure **that could potentially endanger life**. One does not need to wait until the *moment of death* to receive this Sacrament, and, in fact, it's prudent *not* to wait that long to be anointed. The Sacrament can be repeated if one has recovered and becomes sick again, or if the condition for which it was initially received becomes more serious. A reminder I often give in this context: Age and length of years are a blessing from God, not a sickness; the elderly not suffering from some specific condition may, however, approach this Sacrament if *frailty has become pronounced*.

### Stations of the Cross & Musical Reflection

In addition to our customary practice of praying the Stations of the Cross together as a community on Tuesday evenings in Lent following Mass, we are blessed this year to host John Miller, an accomplished professional and liturgical musician, to lead us in a musical reflection and prayer. Join us on Friday, Mar. 16 at 7 PM for this hour long presentation. Tickets are not required, and a cash donation to the musicians of \$10 would be appreciated. 
