



TABS 4 WHEELCHAIRS PROJECT



Since we began collecting in 1993, our generous contributions of tabs have exceeded 3½ tons of donated aluminum to help the Royal Canadian Legion in Elora convert the tabs into cash to help needy individuals requiring walkers, wheelchairs or motorized scooters because of birth defects, paralysis, disease or injuries. As of April 17th, we have brought our thermometer reading to 147 “full-tubs”. We are encouraged to join people from Britain, Alaska, California, Japan and all points in between to continue collecting pull-tabs (from drink cans). 2½ million tabs are needed to purchase one average wheelchair for distribution to those who need assistance with the purchase price. Since its inception in 1989, this project has helped provide over 2,209 wheelchairs by the combined efforts of all area Royal Canadian Legions. It does work! CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK

Catholic Education Week 2018 begins this Sunday, May 6th. The Catholic schools in our parish will engage in a series of events to celebrate the ongoing gift of publicly funded Catholic education. You are invited to discover what celebrations are happening in your children's school and if possible, attend. Publicly funded Catholic education has existed in Ontario since 1841 and its graduates have served Ontario and Canada very well. The current generation of students in our publicly funded Catholic schools will serve with the same spirit and generosity as their previous generations.



This year's Catholic Education Week theme is "*Renewing the Promise*." The theme for CEW 2018 draws upon previous documents on Ontario Catholic education, namely, "This Moment of Promise" (1989), "Fulfilling the Promise" (1993) and "Our Catholic Schools" (2006-2007). These three documents, while several years apart from each other, all speak of the unique mission of Ontario Catholic education, the importance of its shared leadership by all those involved in Catholic education and the critical role of Catholic education in contemporary society.

Catholic Education Week 2018 combines the themes of reconciliation, solidarity, love, justice and ecology.
