

LOVE AND THE ASCENSION

Have you ever spent time in an airport, just watching people say farewell to loved ones? What an incredible range of human emotions you see on their faces: excitement, anticipation, sometimes sadness, emptiness and anxiety. The disciples in today's gospel must also have felt all of those things as they heard and saw Jesus for the last time. While undoubtedly they would have been elated that he was going to his Father, there must also have been a real sense of loss at the thought of parting forever from one who had become the centre of their lives. In a way, it's comforting that the disciples had those feelings because it tells us that they were ordinary people like ourselves. And yet these same ordinary people went on to proclaim the message of Jesus to the whole world. How encouraging that is for us, especially when we feel inadequate in living out our Christian commitment. Too often we dwell on what we can't do or who we are not. We compare ourselves to people of great faith and find ourselves lacking. At those times when we doubt our ability to live out our faith, we need only look at the very human Eleven in today's gospel to be assured that God does indeed choose ordinary folk as instruments in bringing the Good News to the world.
